FROM THE INSTITUTE PRESIDENT, MICHAEL COOKE

The past month has been very busy and I am currently in New Zealand for the Division Seminar and AGM but more about that in next month's newsletter. Early in May the AICLA Board met and a number of important outcomes were agreed. The requirements for advancement to Fellow have been revised with a new alternative pathway based on 10 years Associate level membership of AICLA introduced. Full details of the fellowship pathways are attached. A workshop for trainee loss adjusters, with no restrictions on age, will be held in Sydney on 31 July 2013 one day prior to CC13. We are delighted to have highly regarded and experienced members volunteer their time for what we hope will be an annual event. The workshop is open to both member and nonmember loss adjusters and will be held at the Novotel Rockford in Darling Harbour. For further details see below.

A project to record the history of the loss adjusting profession in Australia, New Zealand and Asia will be commenced in 2013/14 and I know there are many members who will be keen to contribute to this project. Our plan is to appoint a suitably qualified professional to coordinate the project and interview interested members. I will let you know more about this project once we have made an appointment.

It was also agreed to develop a series of professional development workshops for use by divisions covering areas such as contract works, ISR and business interruption. These will be developed with the aid of a training expert to ensure that there are specific learning outcomes. An earlier delivery date for the 2014 AICLA diaries was agreed which of course means divisions need to start now approaching advertisers. The diary remains a significant promotional item and generates substantial revenue.

Later in the year our Chief Executive, Tony Libke and I will be attending meetings of members in all Australian States. This will be an opportunity for members to hear first-hand about AICLA developments and also for members to express their views. Dates of these meeting will be advised to members.

My hearty congratulations to the AICLA 2012 academic prize winners. Well done Chloe Zhou, Crawford & Company (Australia) Pty Ltd on collecting the Diploma Prize, Syd McDonald Young Adjuster Prize and the Charles Buchanan Prize it is rare for all three of these prizes to be won by a single student, an outstanding achievement. I will be in a position to announce the winner of the Carey Bird Scholarship next month as we are in the final stages of assessment of entries.

During the month Tony Libke and I held meetings with the Chief Executives and other senior staff at the Insurance Council of Australia and National Insurance Brokers Association. AICLA has a strong relationship with both Rob Whelan (ICA) and Dallas Booth (NIBA) and part of these meetings is to deepen the understanding between our organisations. We have close ties with ICA through the Disaster Management Secretariat headed by Karl Sullivan. Also the ICA General Insurance Code of Practice is currently subject to an independent review, which has been completed and release of that report is imminent. As reported previously AICLA is seeking for the term "Loss Adjuster" to be defined in the Code and has suggested minimum training and education standards for those calling themselves loss adjusters. So clearly we are anxious to see the final recommendations as they will impact all members in Australia.

Dallas Booth encouraged loss adjusters to become more active in contributing information for the NIBA magazine Insurance Risk and Professional. In particular they would like to run more stories where the benefit of loss adjusters working with brokers had achieved positive outcomes for both the insured and insurer. Neil Maidment is the NIBA Communications Manager (nmaidment@niba.com.au) and he said articles need not be written by loss adjusters as they have journalist able to conduct an interview. I would also say the Insurance News (www.insurancenews.com.au or ring +61 3 9499 5538) have made similar offers, so if you have a story why not contact one of the two publications.

Meetings were also held with the CEO's and or senior management of the major loss adjusting companies. These meetings were very positive and we were able to outline the re-accreditation of the Diploma of Loss Adjusting, new lower diploma enrolment fees, the CPD workshops, Trainee Workshop project, the career pathways and also looked at ways of boosting AICLA membership.

The Claims Convention is only eight weeks away and I encourage all members to attend what is the major claims convention held each year. The event has grown steadily each year and is anticipated to achieve record numbers this year. More information about the convention is below.

ON-LINE CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD)

TECHNOLOGY FOR ADJUSTERS — 3D PRINTING

We live in a world of technology. Whether we like it or not, modern life is an apparently dizzying rush through successive new technologies. The power to get things done relies more and more on enough understanding of the various technical aids to life to effectively use them, with the added bonus that a more in-depth understanding usually makes their use easier and more efficient.

We have touched on various technologies before, and now introduce within our on-line CPD program a series of occasional papers aimed at helping adjusters make sense of the many new devices we are becoming surrounded with.

The first of these papers deals with an item apparently not in the adjuster's toolkit — at least so far! Yet it is a device that is being heard of more and more. It is the so-called 3D printer. This paper aims to widen the adjuster's knowledge beyond the everyday business of insurance claims. It will not enable you to become an expert, but it will help you to understand what the experts say, and perhaps detect when the speaker is not an expert either!
